Results of NIIT

Of the 22 students who passed NIIT Foundation's Computer Certificate Course in IT for Beginners, 14 got over 80% and 3 got over 90% marks. Their prestigious certificate will be extremely helpful in obtaining jobs.

Arpana Hospital

Ongoing Partnership with CBM for Eye Camps

Diabetic Retinopathy camps by Arpana Hospital were held in 8 villages and 903 patients had their eyes checked. If needed, free surgeries are performed to correct eyesight.

Pediatric camps by Arpana Hospital were also held in 8 villages and 969 students have had their eyes screened.

Dialysis machine: A Dialysis machine, donated by the Baij Nath Bhandari Public Charitable Trust, was installed at Arpana Hospital. This is a huge value add-on to the existing services being provided to our financially less privileged rural brethren.

New Gynae OPD: One more gynae OPD clinic was established at Arpana Hospital so that doctors can better care for the increasing number of patients.

Empowering the Differently Abled

Meeting Officials in Karnal: 14 persons from 8 Disabled Persons Organisations visited the District Social Welfare Office and the Office of Education for the Disabled. They also went to the Chief Minister's window, where any citizen can submit an application regarding any problem faced by him.

Workshop of Leaders of Disabled Persons: 5 differently abled women leaders were included among the 20 women in a Training of Trainers workshop held in Arpana for 2 days, conducted by ASK, a national NGO based in Delhi. These women learned to plan training modules and to effectively conduct a training session. They also scripted a play on sanitation encouraging cleanliness, building toilets and recycling waste. These activities enhanced their sense of self worth and confidence.

Differently Abled Persons Function

On 15th April, about 80 people gathered at Arpana Trust House, Madhuban as Dr. Ela Anand, Director Arpana Medical Services, presided at a function to present assistive devices and tricycles to 9 differently abled persons from rural areas.



Naresh, 32 years old, has been unable to walk from birth. He has only studied up to class 2. He has two children and one acre of land for the family's livelihood.

He was very grateful for the mobility provided by his tricycle.



Jeeto had polio in childhood and has been housebound. She can now attend group meetings with her tricycle!

The Gajnoi Farmers Producers Cooperative Society

Members of Arpana's Self Help Groups and Farmers Clubs, founded the Gajnoi Farmers Producers Cooperative Society Ltd. on 14th March. 54 men and women registered as members, contributing their share of Rs. 500 each. Benefits include marketing and new information.



Eco Tourism: A meeting of Arpana's Youth Groups was held on April 22 by Mrs. Aruna Dayal, Director Arpana Development Services, to discuss the scope of local eco tourism including the need for tourist guides and trekking guides as well as rooms for tourists in local homes. Arpana's new program to give training for these income generating opportunities was greeted with great enthusiasm.

Farmers Exposure Visit 20 members of Arpana's Farmers Clubs attended a two day exposure visit under NABARD at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Saru {Chamba} on March 16–17. Arpana's farmer members, who used to subsist on incomes less than Rs.10,000 a year, are now earning up to Rs.250,000 a year, largely through information from exposure visits.

Free Medical Camp: This camp, sponsored by NABARD, was held at village Kolka, on 12th April. The doctor examined 112 patients from interior villages, most of whom were not able to reach the Government Hospital in Chamba.
