# Chank You, Chhote Ma!

Dr. Ela Anand's tribute at the Prayer Meeting for Pujya Chhote Ma



Today we have gathered together to offer our *Shraddhanjali* to Pujya Chhote Ma and thank the Lord for giving her the strength to bear her bodily pain and ending the discomfort which she bore so patiently.

I would like to thank her for what she has been to me, an elder sister, a guide, and latterly a mother who demonstrated the qualities of love, patience and sincerity in her life.

In the first few years of my association with her, I was privileged to observe how she quietly gave comfort to Mr. C.L. Anand (Pitaji) whilst his wife (Bibiji) was suffering so much in her last illness. Her discussions with him on spirituality, a subject of great interest to him, enabled her to divert his attention away from watching Bibiji's suffering anxiously. She was successful in giving him those moments of peace. This made a deep impression on me.

It was in our Nursing Home phase that she introduced us to the beauties of Urvashi and Spirituality. She demonstrated her humility when she made enormous quantities of *halva* to be distributed as *prasad* at the inaugural function.

She demonstrated her patience when our attention strayed and we got up either to attend to plants or to patients, thus interrupting her. She also fitted in with our timings by either taking *satsangs* elsewhere or by accompanying Dr. Anand on his drive to the ESI Hospital where he worked. Gradually we began to

spend more time with her. She would also give examples from her own life with Pujya Ma without glossing over her own faults. Sometimes when we did not understand the practical nature of what she said, she would also give examples from Bollywood films that she would take us to see. This enabled us to understand that spirituality was not just listening and reciting the divine words of Urvashi but it enables us to apply the various tenets in our own lives. This made a tremendous difference in my interpersonal relationships both at home and in my professional life. It taught me to introspect and to recognize my own weakness.

Pujya Chhote Ma thus steadied the boat of my life.

I owe Pujya Chhote Ma a huge debt for the beauty that she brought into my life and will always be grateful to her. Pujya Chhote Ma played a huge role in the creation of *bhajans* by Dr. Anand. She chose the words for this initially but gradually the words were selected during her *satsangs* and more than 300 *bhajans* were composed by Dr. Anand in this way.

In fact Urvashi was Chhote Ma's life. The divine outflow of verse which issued from Pujya Ma's lips was faithfully recorded by Chhote Ma in her own inimitable shorthand which was transcribed later in her very readable hand writing. In this way 26 large *shastras* were produced of prayers, *satsangs*, 3 readings of the Gita and the Upanishads. If it had not been for Chhote Ma this divine work would have been lost to posterity. If it had not been for her then Dr. Anand and I would not have developed a desire to know the meaning of 'Love All'.

Pujya Chhote Ma's love for all was displayed in small gestures. She made these for the entire extended family and *satsangis* on all occasions such as birthdays as well as in their sad moments. She displayed her compassion towards all. She never had any guile or ill feeling towards anyone.

In her last illness she displayed an unusual calm and patience. She was totally uncomplaining and bestowed her blessings on each one of us. She had immense faith in Dr. R.I. Singh and was content to be completely under his care. Indeed he left no stone unturned and explored every possibility of trying to give her relief. It is with heartfelt gratitude that I must thank Dr. Singh for his unusual empathy which gave Chhote Ma so much comfort. He said to me, 'I am doing it for myself.' I would also like to thank all the staff, doctors and the matron specially for looking after her.

I would also like to thank Dr. Rahul Gupta for his careful and caring coordination of Chhote Ma's treatment at Fortis Escorts Hospital, Delhi.

Thank you Chhote Ma for being my mother and guide in the last 40+ years. I shall miss you and always remember you with love and gratitude. •

# An Abiding Relationship



My association with Arpana began on hearing Pujya Chhote Ma's satsangs at Lajpat Bhavan about 37 years ago. Her explanations of the Shastras through the beautiful expositions of Urvashi had me spellbound. Later for about fourteen years Chhote Ma came to Nizamuddin for the monthly satsang week in Delhi. We not only got the opportunity to hear the Urvashi shastras in depth from her, but during the drives to the various venues, during mealtimes, while watching movies and so on, we could discuss all manner of topics and she would, in her affectionate way, tell us Param Pujya Ma's way of looking at and dealing with daily life. What would amaze me was that she never hesitated to narrate incidents which showed her in a negative light, to highlight some point of Ma's teaching, so that we could better appreciate the beauty of Ma's way of looking at life.

While working in Arpana's Publications department, I would be scrutinising the Urvashi data entry for spelling errors. She was an M.A. in Hindi, and I had studied Hindi only as a compulsory subject. But she gave me the freedom to question what was written, and she would say, "I knew nothing about the language of the *Shastras* when I came to Ma, and my hand only wrote down what the ears heard." What humility, to allow people less qualified than you to question your life's work!

Apart from *satsangs*, we knew Chhote Ma as an expert in knitting, but she amazed us with lessons in cooking too! She never forgot a birthday and was always ready with a gift for each one. On trips to places of pilgrimage, Chhote Ma was the most energetic member of the group. How can I forget our trip to Vaishno Devi, when my son got severe asthma on the way. She walked with us at a leisurely pace for 12 hours, so that he too could reach the *mandir* and

receive the blessings of Ma Vaishno Devi. Her enthusiasm was infectious. One year she came to celebrate Ganesh Chaturthi with us, and she gave us a beautiful and new way of understanding the significance of Ganeshji.

Our lives were touched by her love in innumerable ways. She will always be with us.

### Ongoing Partnership with CBM for Eye Camps

**Pediatric camps** by Arpana Hospital were also held in 8 villages and 969 students have had their eyes screened.

### **Empowering the Differently Abled**

**Meeting Officials in Karnal:** 14 persons from 8 Disabled Persons Organisations visited the District Social Welfare Office and the Office of Education for the Disabled. They also went to the Chief Minister's window, where any citizen can submit an application regarding any problem faced by him.

**Workshop of Leaders of Disabled Persons:** 5 differently abled women leaders were included among the 20 women in a Training of Trainers workshop held in Arpana for 2 days, conducted by ASK, a national NGO based in Delhi. These women learned to plan training modules and to effectively conduct a training session. They also scripted a play on sanitation encouraging cleanliness, building toilets and recycling waste. These activities enhanced their sense of self worth and confidence.

### **Differently Abled Persons Function**

On 15<sup>th</sup> April, about 80 people gathered at Arpana Trust House, Madhuban as Dr. Ela Anand, Director Arpana Medical Services, presided at a function to present assistive devices and tricycles to 9 differently abled persons from rural areas.

Naresh, 32 years old, has been unable to walk from birth. He has only studied up to class 2. He has two children and one acre of land for the family's livelihood. He was very grateful for the mobility provided by his tricycle.





Jeeto had polio in childhood and has been housebound. She can now attend group meetings with her tricycle!

### The Gajnoi Farmers Producers Cooperative Society

Members of Arpana's Self Help Groups and Farmers Clubs, founded the Gajnoi Farmers Producers Cooperative Society Ltd. on 14<sup>th</sup> March. 54 men and women registered as members, contributing their share of Rs. 500 each. Benefits include marketing and new information.



**Eco Tourism:** A meeting of Arpana's Youth Groups was held on April 22 by Mrs. Aruna Dayal, Director Arpana Development Services, to discuss the scope of local eco tourism including the need for tourist guides and trekking guides as well as rooms for tourists in local homes. Arpana's new program to give training for these income generating opportunities was greeted with great enthusiasm.

**Farmers Exposure Visit:** 20 members of Arpana's Farmers Clubs attended a two day exposure visit under NABARD at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Saru {Chamba} on March 16-17. Arpana's farmer members, who used to subsist on incomes less than Rs.10,000 a year, are now earning up to Rs.250,000 a year, largely through information from exposure visits.

**Free Medical Camp**: This camp, sponsored by NABARD, was held at village Kolka, on 12th April. The doctor examined 112 patients from interior villages, most of whom were not able to reach the Government Hospital in Chamba.

FROM THE SRIMAD BHAGAVAD GITA

Even after Ma relinquished her mortal body, Chhote Ma's devotion to her 'Soul's Essence' was exhibited in her constant endeavour to speak of Ma, oft relating little life-stories that illustrated some scriptural tenet, and always, to lead each one towards what she herself knew to be the Supreme Essence of life. Indeed, Lord Krishna Himself says in the Gita, that 'Such a One doubtlessly attains Me!' How fortunate are we, who have stayed in the shadow of such a precious bhakta of the Lord, and gained an understanding of Ma's Word from her. Thank you, our dearest, most respected and most beautiful 'Little Mother' for all that you gave to us so generously.

य इमं परमं गुद्धं मद्भक्तेष्वभिधास्यति । भक्तिं मयि परां कृत्वा मामेवैष्यत्यसंशयः । ।

He, who out of love for Me, imparts the deeply mystical Truth contained in this knowledge to My devotees, shall doubtlessly attain Me.

Chapter 18, shloka 68

Param Pujya Ma says, Little one, understand this carefully... The Lord now speaks of the deserving...

He describes those deserving of this knowledge of Truth;

- a) Those who love this supreme, secret knowledge.
- b) Those who colour their life in its hues.
- c) Those who wish to embody this knowledge in their life.
- d) Those who become an embodiment of this knowledge.
- e) Those who regard this supremely mystical knowledge as My injunction and command.
- f) Those who perceive this knowledge as My message to them. Those people believe Me and will tread the path taught by Me.
- 1. Such people will engage in selfless deeds.
- 2. They will devote themselves to Me selflessly.
- 3. They will be steeped in this pure, selfless knowledge.
- 4. They will occupy themselves in the service of all for the welfare of all beings.
- 5. They will not initiate any project for self-establishment.
- 6. They will have a bond of friendship with all.
- 7. They will be replete with divine qualities.
- 8. They will be *gunatit* unaffected by qualities.
- 9. They will inevitably attain a stable intellect of equanimity.
- 10. They will dwell among the most ordinary people, in total identification with them.
- 11. They will not create any conflict in the minds of people.
- 12. They will be dutiful.
- 13. They will possess an attitude of impartiality towards acclaim and insult.
- 14. They will view both loss and gain, victory and defeat objectively.
- 15. They will love each one who engages in this dharma.
- 16. They will love all the good and the wicked.

Such people will measure the Lord by His life. They will endeavour to understand His qualities through His life's precept and then they will translate those attributes in their own lives. Actually, one can inculcate qualities in oneself through understanding those qualities. And if one has true love in one's heart, then the qualities of one's Divine Beloved are bound to irradiate one's life.

Thereafter, when such a devotee exhibits and thus explains those qualities through the example of his own life to others who love the Truth, then those lovers of the Truth also imbibe these same qualities in their own life. Thus the knowledge of the Gita will flow through life.

#### Love

Let me explain the connotation of love to you again:

- 1. Surrender is another name for love.
- 2. The acquisition of knowledge and its practical application, is another name for love.

- 3. One who loves, is ever trying to know his Beloved.
- 4. One who loves, ever endeavours to identify with his Beloved.
- 5. The culmination of love is union.
- 6. The consequence of love is *Advaita* or non-duality.
- 7. Love inspires the lover to forget the body-self.
- 8. Love inspires the lover to forget the mind and all mental turmoil.
- 9. Love is self forgetfulness.
- 10.Love humbles the intellect.
- 11. Love makes a man diligent concerning his duty.
- 12. Love transforms a human being into a divine being.
- 13. Endurance and austerity is another name for love. One who loves, tolerates all smilingly.
- 14. Charity is another name for love.

### The one who loves

- 1. The one who loves offers up his body, mind and wealth to his Beloved.
- 2. His all is available always for his Beloved.
- 3. The one who loves, makes a constant effort to please his Beloved.
- 4. He always feels that what he does for his Beloved is insufficient.
- 5. He always feels that he has done nothing for his Beloved.
- 6. He always feels that he can never do anything for his Beloved.
- 7. He lives merely for the pleasure of his Beloved.
- 8. The establishment of his Beloved is the sole aim of his life.
- 9. Love is selfless.
- 10. Every act of the one who loves, is selfless in essence.
- 11. His worship is selfless.
- 12. His knowledge is selfless.
- 13. He makes no project for his personal establishment in fact he renounces all actions that stem from selfish desire.

My little one,

- Such a one does not even remember his name.
- Such a one has forgotten his body-self.
- Such a one is indifferent to his mind.

How can love remain conscious of the '1'? It is his Beloved who takes the place of the '1'. Gradually, such a one forgets everything else – love is his spontaneous nature.

- 1. Such a one is ever pure.
- 2. Such a one is loyal and true.
- 3. Such a one is ever grateful.
- 4. Such a one has firmly and resolutely placed his entire trust in the Truth.
- 5. Humility is his nature but he does not make a show of his humility.

- 6. He is generosity itself, but he does not impress his magnanimous deeds on the other.
- 7. He does everything for the other, but remains ever hidden.
- 8. He does not expect nor even allow the knot of gratitude to bind the heart of his beloved.
- 9. How can one describe the compassion of such a one who establishes the other even at the cost of personal deprivation?
- 10. Self abnegation is the basic essence of the life of such a one.
- 11. Self control and self denial is the essence of such a one's life.
- 12. Where can there be any question of forgiveness when such a one abides in complete self forgetfulness?

The pathways of love are indeed strange. People consider the one who loves to be intoxicated. This is also true. The life of such a one is an unbroken string of *yagya* or self sacrificing deeds. Into the fire of that *yagya* of selflessness he continually pours the oblations of his own being, and the ones he loves, constantly receive the sanctified fruits of such a one's *yagya*.

The essence of such a one's life is supremely purifying knowledge. Every experience of such a one's life is a supreme experience.

#### The Essence of one who loves

- 1. It is but natural for such a one to be uninfluenced by all attributes.
- 2. Divine qualities are his servitors.
- 3. Divine attributes are his adornments.
- 4. Such a one has a stable intellect since it is free of the limitations of the 'I'.

### The consequence of love

Such love transforms an ordinary being into a divine deity; it transforms a deity into an *Atmavaan* who abides in the *Atma*-Self. It has the power to make the *Atmavaan* the Supreme Lord! These are the hues of love.

If one loves the Lord, then the individual:

- a) begins to love all the children of the Lord;
- b) begins to love the attributes of the Lord;
- c) begins to become attached to the Lord.

Since the Lord is the focus of the devotee's love, the latter does not care about what he receives from the world.

### The meaning of love for the Lord

My little one, the Lord's very own Abha, listen!

- 1. The sincerity of one who loves the Lord, is with the Lord's attributes.
- 2. His sincerity lies with the qualities of divinity.
- 3. His eyes are focused on the Lord and his body-self is offered to the Lord.

The truth is, that it is extremely difficult to recognise the flow of his divinity. Let me explain this mystery to you.

### The life of one who loves the Lord

Such a one forgives the other's flagrant transgressions, but is seen to flare up at the other's minor misdeeds! Thus he seems to be most ordinary amongst the ordinary. And ordinary people find it hard to forgive him and doubt his very state, judging him by these small acts.

On the other hand, such a one loves even the one who, all his life, continues to disgrace him; he opposes even the seemingly most insignificant act of the other, if it is in the interest of the other's happiness.

If you do not possess the power of endurance or toleration, if you do not have any attachment for the qualities of the Lord, if you do not love the qualities of the Supreme Overlord, then renounce any desire or expectation of attaining the Lord.

The Lord Himself says, "If those devotees of Mine, who love Me thus, impart the knowledge of the Gita to those who have faith, they will surely attain Me. Little one,

- 1. Such a devotee will embody all the knowledge that he preaches.
- 2. Such a devotee will be proof of all the knowledge he endows.
- 3. Such a devotee will manifest all the knowledge he imparts. He is the Essence and manifestation of knowledge.

न च तस्मान्मनुष्येषु कश्चिन्मे प्रियकृत्तमः। भविता न च मे तस्मादन्यः प्रियतरो भवि।।

There is no man on earth who does Me a dearer service, nor is there anyone who is dearer to Me than one who loves Me, and who imparts this secret knowledge of Mine to My devotees.

Chapter 18, Shloka 69

Look little one, the Lord is specifying His own preference.

### The loving devotee

- 1. Such a one is akin to the Lord.
- 2. His qualities match those of the Lord.
- 3. He is the knower of the Lord's qualities their essence and their manifest form.
- 4. He is an *anubhavi* he has experienced the Truth.
- 5. His own life is fragrant with the Lord's divine qualities.
- 6. He has understood spiritual knowledge by illuminating it with the light of the Lord's life.

7. He has consecrated his body, mind and intellect at the altar of the Lord's divine qualities.

Such a one will protect the divine attributes even at the cost of his life. He would relinquish his life:

- a) but he will not risk the loss of the attribute of forgiveness;
- b) but he will not lose his sincerity;
- c) but he will not renounce his loving nature;
- d) but he will not forgo his compassion;
- e) but he will not let justice be sacrificed.

Such a one can never harbour a desire for the establishment of his body-self. Little one, understand this if you can:

- 1. Such a one has donned the veil of love.
- 2. He has immured himself in the Lord's Name.
- 3. He has forgotten his body and mind and their desires.
- 4. No longer does the 'I' rule him; he is ruled by the Lord.
- 5. He has given his body-self to the Lord.

Such people are extremely ordinary, yet who can be more extraordinary than they?

The Lord says, "Such people are dear to Me. There is none who is dearer to Me on the face of this earth. No matter what they do, they are infinitely precious for Me."

The attributes of such a one's saintliness are indeed exceptional:

- 1. Such a one will have no pride in his saintliness.
- 2. He cannot distance himself from the other by calling him despicable or evil.
- 3. He lives with ordinary people as an extremely ordinary person.
- 4. He does not destroy the beliefs and concepts of the other.
- 5. He is oblivious to his body-self, his body is ever engaged in the service of others.

Even though identified with others' desires, such a one abides in his divine essence and thus conducts his life.

- Who can be the enemy of one who is forgiveness itself?
- Who can be insincere to one who is sincerity itself?
   The Lord says, such elevated souls are dear to Him.
